Homelessness is a real problem in Mobile. People become homeless because of several factors, including: mental illness, loss of jobs, a physical handicap, or struggles with drugs or substance abuse. While homeless people may not always be easy to see, they exist. And they often have children. These children have a hard life. Waking up on the streets, going to school hungry, and leaving school with homework but no home to do the work in. They may live in a different place each night, a hotel, a car, or a shelter. As a result, they have few possessions and almost no personal space.

My project focused around providing some personal possessions to these homeless children, things they might need, and things they might want. Before starting the project, I talked with Denise Riemer, a social worker for the Mobile County Schools, to find out what items would be most useful.

Then, along with the Christ the King faculty and Student Council, we decided on: shampoo, conditioner, water bottles, ear buds, T-shirts, five dollar McDonald's gift deodorant, cards. toothbrushes, and toothpaste. After we had decided upon the items, we assigned them to grades. certain For example, eight grade was assigned ear buds.

We had a great response from all of the classes at Christ the King. We placed all the items in mesh bags, blue for boys, light purple for girls. We got enough supplies to make thirty-four bags. We presented the items to Mr. Jefferson, the CEO of Housing First. He will disperse the bags to homeless children in Mobile. The extra supplies that did not fit in the bags will be donated to other charities in Mobile.
